

EXPENSES

PROGRAM COST: \$3,990

INCLUDED: A three-credit hour spring semester course (taken in load), roundtrip airfare from Cleveland to London Heathrow, airport transportation in London, three 7-Day London Visitor Travel cards for unlimited use on London's Tube and buses, professional tour guide for London, some admission fees, tipping and taxes for all services included in tour itinerary, and European insurance coverage.

Housing: Accommodations are located at University College London in Ramsay Hall, 5 minutes away from the Warren Street stop on the London Tube, single rooms with in-suite sink, community hall bathroom, linens and towels are provided, community hall kitchen available for use (small selection of pots and pans), breakfast daily, 24 hour front desk.

NOT INCLUDED: Expenses for passport, trip interruption/cancellation insurance, lunch, dinner, snacks, telephone calls, laundry, personal spending, optional excursion to Scotland, and independent sightseeing.
